THE BUSINESS

Rockwell Collins (formerly known as B/E Aerospace UK) is the world's leading manufacturer of aircraft passenger cabin interior products for the commercial and business jet aircraft markets. The company has a global presence, located in 30 countries and on six continents.

The US-owned company, which has revenues of \$3 billion, first came to Leighton Buzzard, in Bedfordshire, in 1992, when the firm identified and purchased local businesses working in its sectors.

Rockwell Collins UK Limited's facility, which occupies

close on 100,000 sq ft of land in the Central Bedfordshire town, employs 750 people on site. Its workforce is drawn from an area as diverse as London one hour by rail to the south and Milton Keynes, which is 20 minutes by rail to the north.

A range of high skilled engineering, design and manufacturing jobs are based at the high tech Bedfordshire site. As well as permanent jobs, Rockwell Collins also uses a range of contractors and temps for specific short-term tasks.

Keith Delderfield, Rockwell Collins Vice President of Operations, said good communication links are vital to the company's ability to attract and retain talent. "The railway line into and out of London and Milton Keynes is very important," he said. "We are very pleased to see the creation of a link direct from the new junction 11a of the M1 motorway to Leighton Buzzard and our base on Grovebury Road."

Leighton Buzzard also benefits from access to London Luton Airport, Heathrow, Gatwick and Stansted. Rockwell Collins holds key responsibilities for the all-important airline markets in Europe and especially in the Middle East.

The company's Leighton Buzzard facility designs and manufactures crew rests and galley structures for the aircraft industry, as well as providing aftermarket support.

The market town also hosts the company's Leighton Buzzard Centre of Excellence for Galley Structures, which is engaged in the development of the latest galley systems for new aircraft platforms in addition to other significant interior structures projects.

Rockwell Collins is very active within the local community, sponsoring a range of

young people's sporting clubs, holding industrial days and working with schools in Central Bedfordshire to find individuals interested in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) careers.

THE REQUIREMENTS

Rockwell Collins most important contact with Central Bedfordshire Council concerns issues of planning and development control.

The company has invested £11million over a recent four year period, increasing its workforce by 250 people and changing the use of two warehouse buildings in Leighton Buzzard to manufacturing.
